# Dr. Arnold G. Fruchtenbaum

*The Book of Genesis, 480-81*



*“For he said, I will appease him with the present that goes before me. The Hebrew word for *appease* has the same Hebrew root as ‘atonement.’ What this means is that Jacob was seeking Esau’s forgiveness: *Afterward I will see his face; peradventure he will accept me.*”*



## Isaiah 53:3–6

<sup>3</sup> “He was despised and forsaken of men, A man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; And like one from whom men hide their face He was despised, and we did not esteem Him. <sup>4</sup> Surely our griefs He Himself bore, And our sorrows He carried; Yet we ourselves esteemed Him stricken, Smitten of God, and afflicted. <sup>5</sup> But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; The chastening for our well-being *fell* upon Him, And by His scourging we are healed. <sup>6</sup> All of us like sheep have gone astray, Each of us has turned to his own way; But the LORD has caused the iniquity of us all To fall on Him.”



# False Views of the Atonement

- ◆ Ransom to Satan – Christ's death is a ransom to Satan and not the Father (A.D. 185–54)
- ◆ Moral influence – Christ's death is an expression of God's love (A.D. 1079–1142)
- ◆ Moral example – Christ's death inspires us to be sacrificial (A.D. 1539–1604)
- ◆ Governmental – Christ's death promotes respect for God's Law (A.D. 1583–1645)
- ◆ Accidental – Fate accidentally ended Christ's life

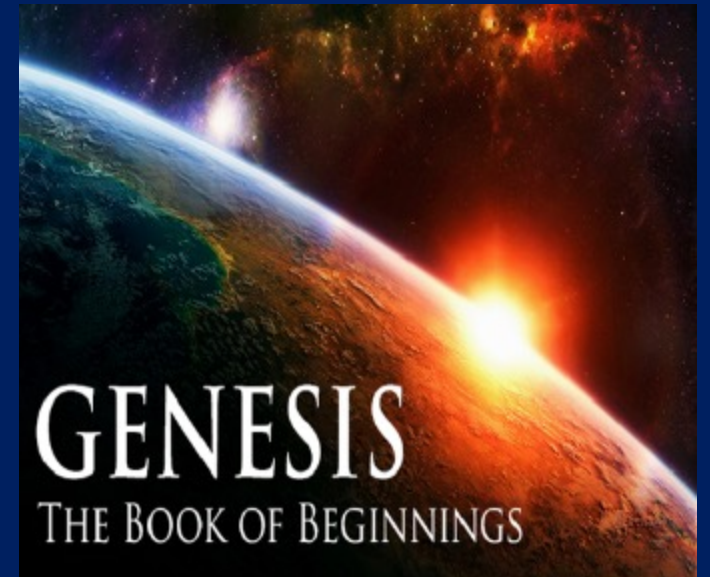

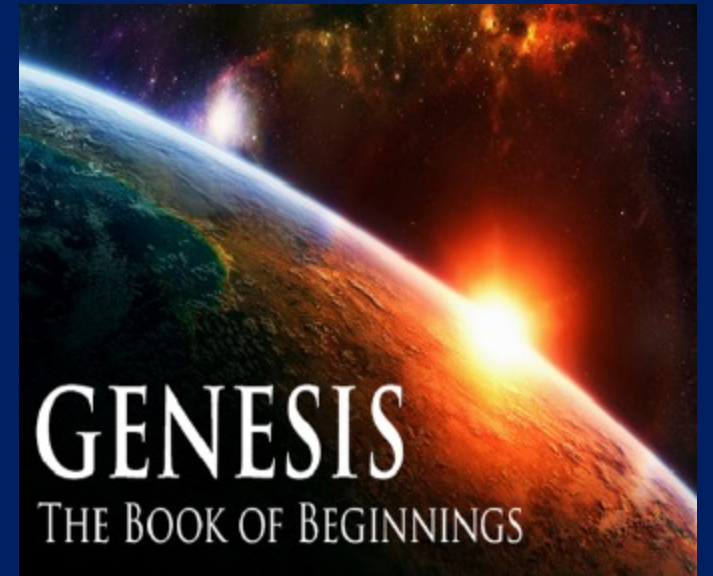
