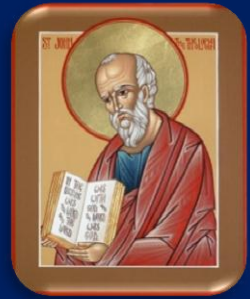

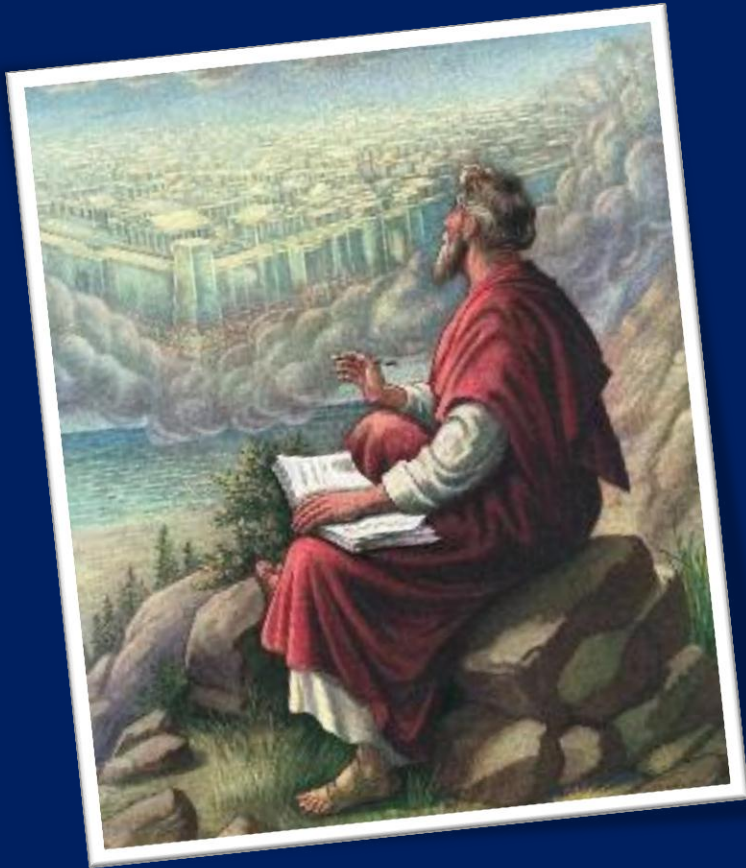

- 7) What is it about? - Jesus gives life to believers
- 8) How does the writer accomplish his goal? - Selective history
- 9) What is inside (outline)? - 5 part outline
- 10) What makes the book different? - Emphasis on believe
