Ezekiel's answer revealed that it would require a power beyond man's to bring this about. It was an answer of reverence, not giving a positive or negative response."



Surely the general tenor of the prophetic Scriptures points in this direction (See Zech. 13:8-9). Otherwise, it is difficult to see how a covenant could be made nationally with such a godless one as the Roman prince of the end times (cf. Dan. 9:27)."




DAN 9:27 OVERVIEW OF TRIBULATION PERIOD





- Search the immediate context
 - Walvoord: 26X
- Search the <u>remote</u> context
 - Old Testament
 - ◆ Thomas: 278 / 404 verses




