

God Will Judge Hypocrisy (2:1-5)

God's judgment will fall on the hypocrite (1-3)

 God's judgment may not be immediate granting time for repentance (4)

God's judgment is sure (5)

General vs. Special Revelation

	General	Special
Examples	Nature, conscience (Rom 1–2)	Incarnation, Scripture, miracles
Availability	All	Some
Accomplishment	Accountability (Rom 1)	Salvation (Acts 4:12; 2 Tim 3:15)
Form	Non-written or non-verbal	Written
Quality	Natural	Supernatural, miraculous
