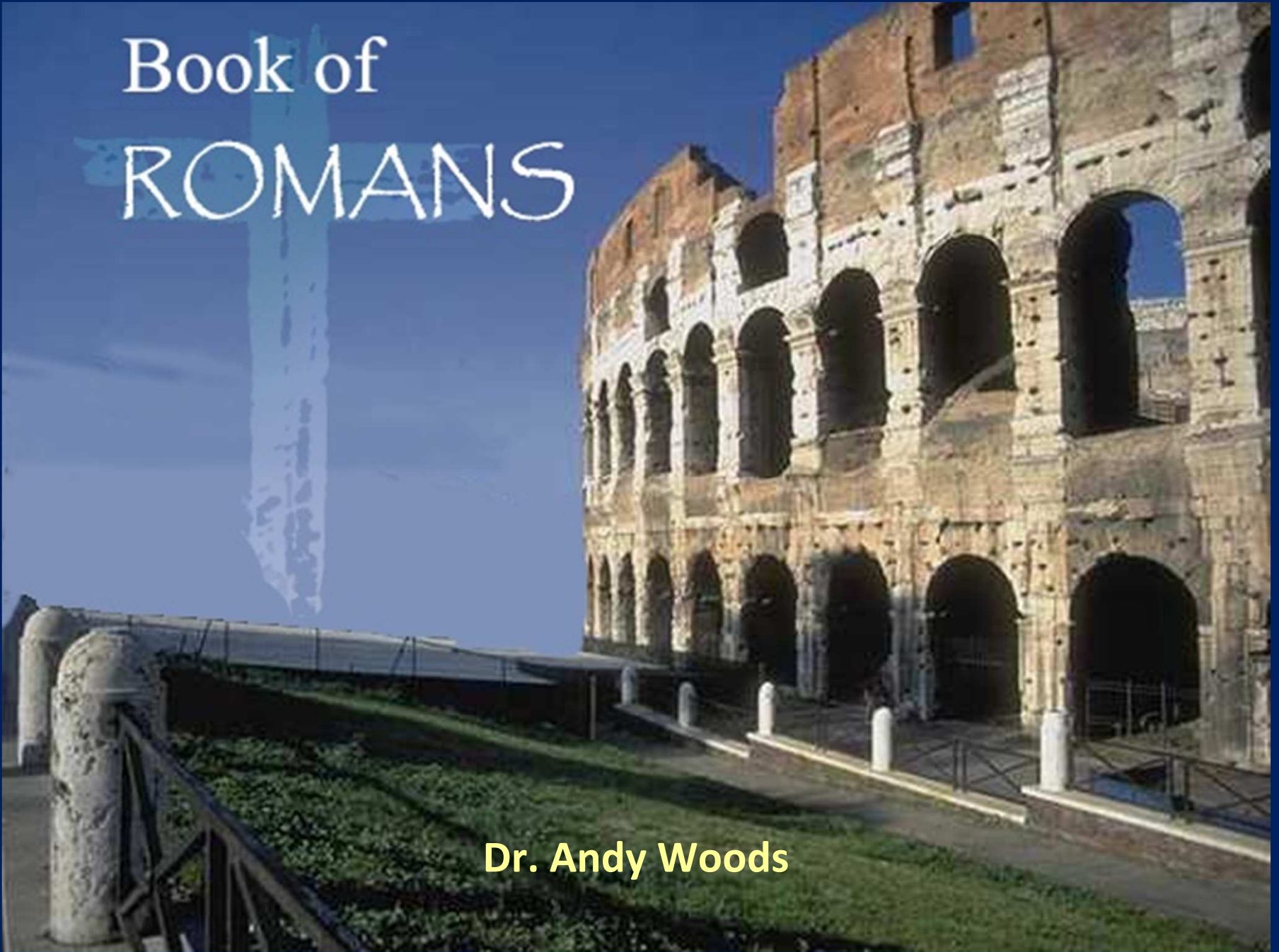
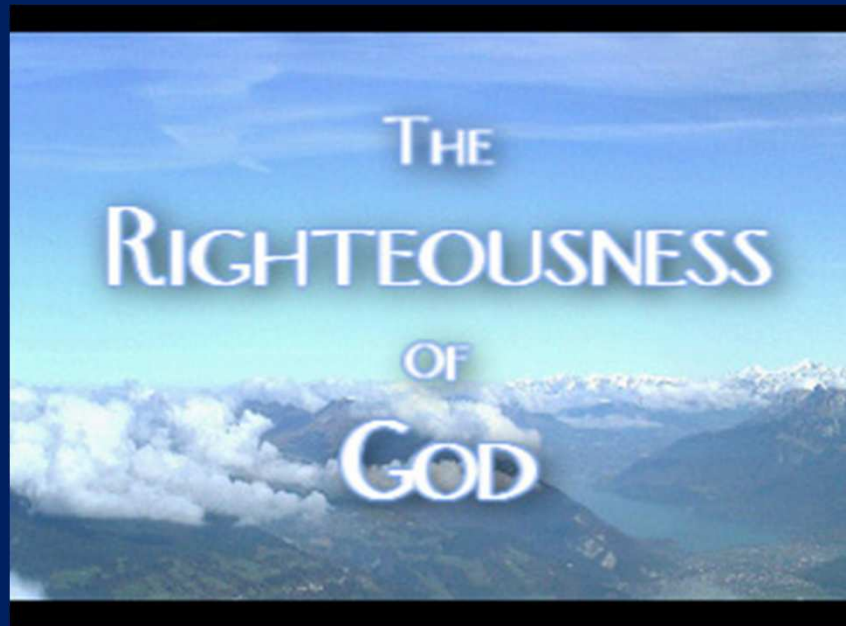

Three Tenses of Salvation

Phase	Justification	Sanctification	Glorification
Tense	Past	Present	Future
Saved from sin's:	Penalty	Power	Presence
Scripture	Eph 2:8-9; Titus 3:5	Philip 2:12	Rom 5:10

6:15-23



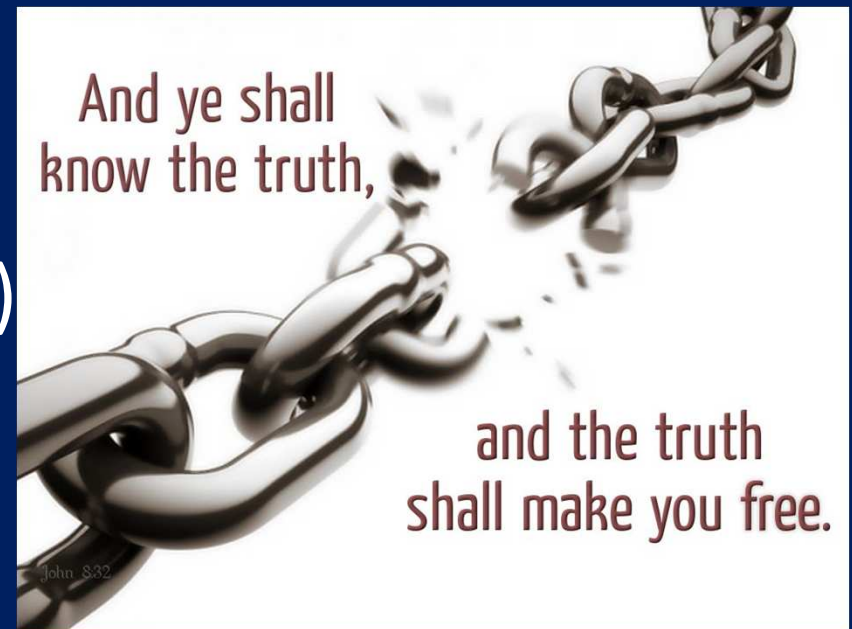

3. Thesis Explained (6:3-11)

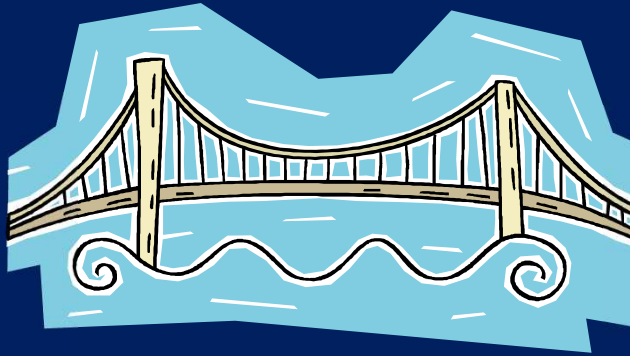
1. Our baptism into Christ (6:3-5)

3. Our baptism into Christ has freed us from sin's power (6:7-8)
