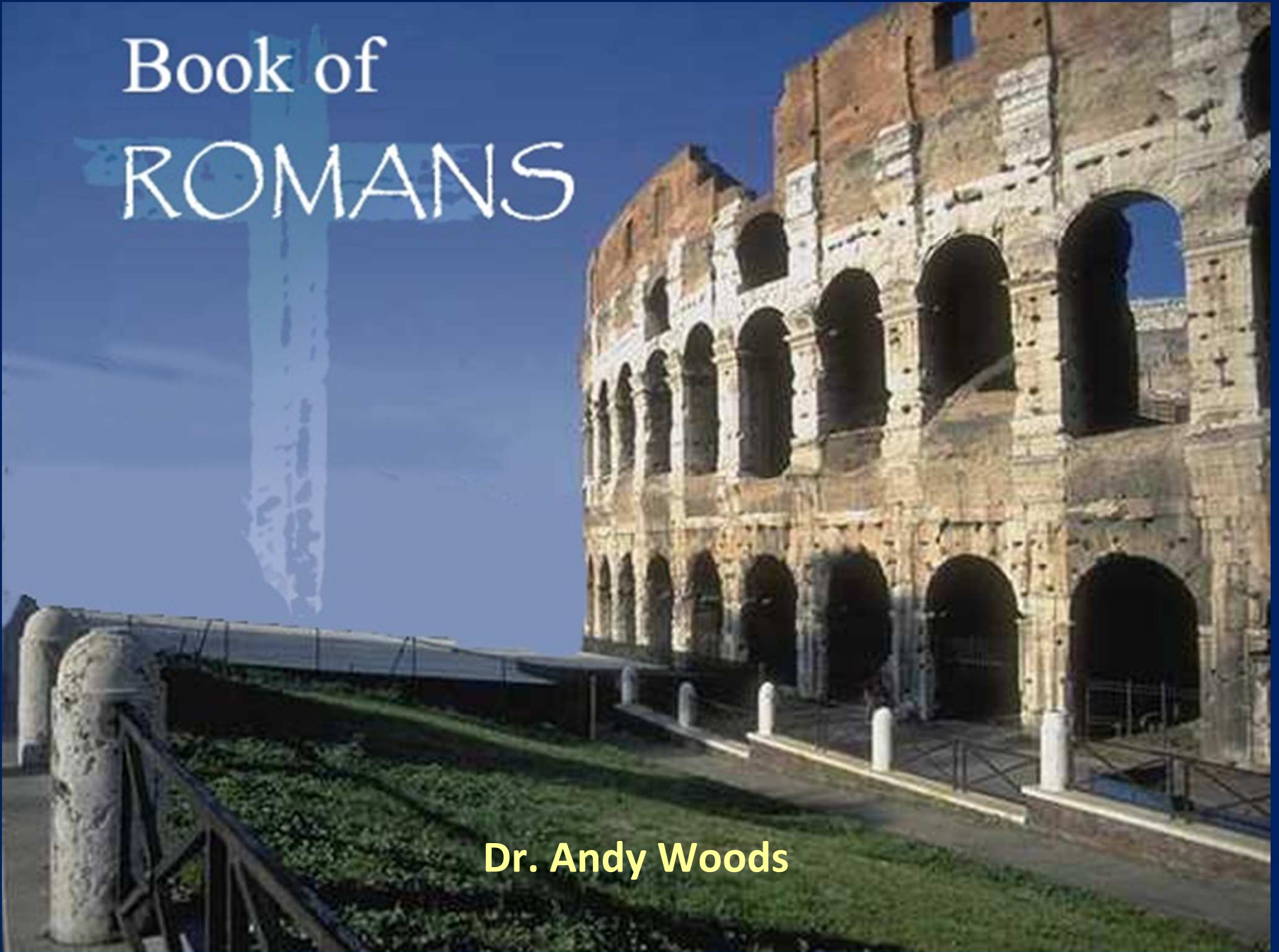
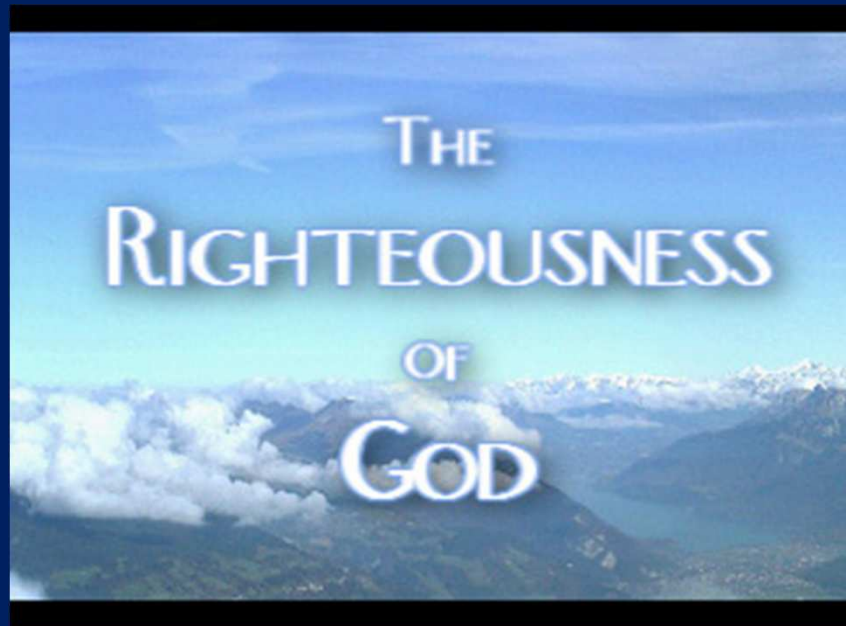

# Three Tenses of Salvation

<b>Phase</b>	<b>Justification</b>	<b>Sanctification</b>	<b>Glorification</b>
<b>Tense</b>	<b>Past</b>	<b>Present</b>	<b>Future</b>
<b>Saved from sin's:</b>	<b>Penalty</b>	<b>Power</b>	<b>Presence</b>
<b>Scripture</b>	<b>Eph 2:8-9; Titus 3:5</b>	<b>Philip 2:12</b>	<b>Rom 5:10</b>

- Believer's relationship to sin-6
- Believer's relationship to the Law-7
- Believer's relationship to the Spirit-8



# Believer's Relationship to Sin (Chapter 6)



- Believers set free from sin – 6:1-14

- Believer as a slave to righteousness – 6:15-23





# Believer's Relationship to the Law (7:1-25)

- 1) Believer's freedom from the Law  
(7:1-6)
- 2) Although the Law is holy sin used it to usher in death (7:7-12)
- 3) Although the Law is holy, it is powerless to deliver someone from sin (7:13-25)

# Believer's Relationship to the Spirit (8:1-39)

- 1) Spirit transferred us from death to life (8:1-11)
- 2) We are not obligated to the flesh but to the Spirit (8:12-17)
- 3) We endure suffering now in the hope of future glory (8:18-30)
- 4) We are secure in Christ (8:31-39)



## Spirit Transferred us From Death to Life (8:1-11)

- 1) Life in the spirit frees the believer from condemnation (8:1-4)
  - a. No condemnation for the believer (1)
  - b. Spirit frees the believer from condemnation and death (2)
  - c. God condemned sin through Christ (3-4)



## Solution (7:24-25)

- 1) Problem stated (7:24a)
- 2) Cry for a solution (7:24b)
- 3) Answer to the problem (7:25a)
- 4) Ensuing conflict (7:25b)



## Spirit Transferred us From Death to Life (8:1-11)

2) Indwelling ministry of the Spirit will empower believers (8:5-11)

a. Spirit and flesh pursue opposite agendas (5-8)



b. Empowerment by the Spirit (9-11)

# Believers Are Obligated Not to the Flesh; To the Spirit (8:12-17)

- 1) Our obligation to the Spirit; not the flesh (12)
- 2) Flesh = death; Spirit = life (13)
- 3) Life in the Spirit described (14-17)



## Life in the Spirit Described (8:14-17)

1) We are now led by the Spirit (14a)

2) Consequences (14b-17)

a. Leading indicates sonship (14b)

b. Sonship indicates childship (15-16)

c. Childship indicates heirship (17)
