

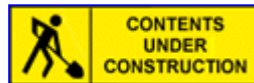

4.4.1 - Chapter 1

The period of testing for the church of Smyrna matches that of Daniel’s request to be tested while forgoing the king’s food. Rather than Revelation referring to Daniel, they both reflect a similar use of the number five (the number of provision). “Although perhaps more subtle than other biblical numerology, five appears to be associated with the idea of provision [and] fullness” ⁴ . The doubling of five to form ten may denote the combined idea of witness (two) and provision (five). ⁵

The portion of the book of Revelation given through John which concerns "the things which will take place after this" has the same historic period in view and augments the information given to Nebuchadnezzar and interpreted by Daniel. (This is made clear by the many allusions and references from the book of Revelation to various chapters in Daniel shown below.)
