No night trials & verdicts	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 4.1	John18:18, 27; Matt. 26:66, 69
Trials to be held in public	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 1.6	Private compound of Annas and Caiaphas
Capital cases required at least 23 judges	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 4.1	No biblical evidence of compliance

No condemnation on basis of accused's sole testimony	Num. 35:30; Deut 17:6-7; 19:15-20	Mark 14;63; Matt. 26:65
Accused could not testify against Himself	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 3.3-4	John 18:19-21; Matt. 26:62-63; Luke 22:67
2-3 witnesses in perfect agreement	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 5.2	Matt. 26:59-61; Mark 14:55-60

Accused not to be mocked, beaten, or mistreated	Numbers 35:9-34; Edersheim <i>Life &</i> <i>Times of the Messiah</i> , 862	John 18:22
Arguments for innocence presented first followed by arguments for guilt	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 4.1	Luke 22:66-71
Unanimity for acquittal but not guilt	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 4.1	Luke 22:70–Luke 23:1; Mark 14:64



Guilt for blasphemy only if God's name is uttered	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 7.5	Mark 14:61-64
Each witness questioned individually & in isolation	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 3.6	Mark 14:60
Admonishment of punishment for false witnesses	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 14.5; <i>Makkot</i> 1.5	Matt. 26:59-62; Mark 15:55-60



Trial and verdict not to occur on same day	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 4.1	Mark 14:62-64
No trial on festival day	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 4.1	John 18:28
Death penalty voting begins with youngest	Mishnah: <i>Sanhedrin</i> 4.2	Mark 14:64
