The Supreme Court:

1. Read words into the First Amendment that simply are not there
2. Relied upon and took out of context a letter written by Thomas Jefferson more than a decade after the Constitution was created
3. Ignored the legislative activities of those who authored the First Amendment
4. Applied the First Amendment to the states in spite of the fact that the First Amendment describes itself only as a limitation upon federal power
5. Ignored the original intent of the Fourteenth Amendment
6. Failed to cite a single precedent
7. Erroneously believed that Christianity causes psychological damage
8. Acted as the Constitution's amender rather than its interpreter
9. Selectively applied their newly created separation doctrine only to Judeo-Christian truth while giving alternative non-Christian religions a virtual free pass
