





Active in Paul's second (Acts 16:1-3; 16–18) and third (Acts 19:22; 20:1-5) missionary journeys

Put in charge at church in Ephesus (1 Tim 1:3)


Paul's Two Roman Imprisonments Contrasted

- First Imprisonment (Acts 28:16-31)
- Wrote prison epistles
- Religious charges
- Local and sporadic persecutions (AD 60-63)
- Decent conditions (house)
- Many friends
- Evangelistic opportunities
- Optimistic for release (Phil 1:24-26)


- Second Imprisonment (2 Tim)
- Wrote 2 Timothy
- Political charges
- Neronian persecution (AD 64-68)
- Poor conditions (dungeon)
- Virtually alone
- Opportunities restricted
- Execution anticipated (2 Tim 4:6)




