2 Samuel 7:12-16

¹² "When your days are complete and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your descendant after you, who will come forth from you, and I will establish his kingdom. ¹³ He shall build a house for My name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. ¹⁴ I will be a father to him and he will be a son to Me; when he commits iniquity, I will correct him with the rod of men and the strokes of the sons of men, ¹⁵ but My lovingkindness shall not depart . . .

"He who overcomes, I will grant to him to sit down with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and <u>sat down with</u> <u>My Father on His throne</u>."






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

- 4. Stephen's death (60)






"A second explanation is that this event may have occurred in A.D. 36. In that year, Vitellus became the new imperial legate of the Province of Syria, which included Judea. He deposed Pontius Pilate from his procuratorship in A.D. 36. Pilate's successor, Marullus, did not arrive until A.D. 38. So there may have been a hiatus or a break between the deposing of Pilate and the arrival of the new procurator. It could very well be that the stoning of Stephen occurred during this time, which would have left the Sanhedrin without tight Roman oversight. A third explanation is that this was a mob scene, and mobs do not regard the rules of law."



1 Thessalonians 4:13-18
