### Daniel 11:25-26

- 1. Ptolemy VI Philometer (son of Cleopatra of Egypt) readies for an attack against the Syrians & Antiochus IV
- 2. Antiochus' IV preemptive attack against Egypt
- 3. Egyptian disunity & conspiracy at the highest levels
- 4. Antiochus' IV victory over Egypt
- 5. Ongoing confusion and disunity in Egypt
- 6. Rival throne in Egypt between Ptolemy VI and his younger brother Ptolemy VII Physkon
- 7. Antiochus IV departs thinking the Egyptians will destroy themselves

### Daniel 11:27

- 1. Warfare between Syria and Egypt indecisive
- 2. Treaties and agreements put on the table
- 3. Not done for desire for peace but rather out of kings' "intent on evil" to get advantage over the other side
- Sitting down at the "same table" is indicative of Middle Eastern agreements
- Characterized by spoken "lies," deception, and ineffectiveness since "the end is still to come" "at the appointed time"

#### Daniel 11:28

- Although Antiochus IV did not conquer Egypt, he left with "much plunder" or the spoils of war
- As Antiochus IV returned to Syria he revealed his hatred for Israel ("the people of the covenant")
- Antiochus IV paused long enough in Israel to plunder the Temple and murder many Hebrew people

<sup>"20</sup> And Antiochus, after he had smitten Egypt, returned in the one hundred and fifty-third year, and went up against Israel and Jerusalem with a great army. <sup>21</sup> And in (his) arrogance he entered into the sanctuary, and took the golden altar, and the candlestick for the light, and all its accessories, <sup>22</sup> and the table of the shewbread, and the cups, and the bowls, and the golden censers, and the veil, and the crowns, and the golden adornment on the façade of the Temple, and he scaled it all off. <sup>23</sup> Moreover, he took the silver, and the gold, and the choice vessels; he also took the hidden treasures which he found. <sup>24</sup> And having taken everything, he returned to his own land.<sup>25</sup> 'And there was great mourning in Israel in every place."

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## Daniel 11:29


- 1. Several years later "at the appointed time"
- Antiochus IV "will return and come into the south" by launching yet another attack on the Ptolemies of Egypt
- 3. "But...it will not turn out like it did before" since the Ptolemy brothers (Ptolemy VI & VII) now ruling a united Egypt & the rise of Rome ended Antiochus IV Egyptian conquest

## Daniel 11:30


- 1. "Ships of Kittim" = Rome
- 2. Rome stopped Antiochus IV from conquering Greece
- 3. Rome sent Caius Popilius Lenas with soldiers to Egypt
- 4. Antiochus IV appreciated Rome's power
- Embittered Antiochus IV never gave up his dreams of conquest
- 6. An Angry Antiochus IV left Egypt and entered Israel to quell a minor uprising
- 7. Antiochus IV killed and enslaved tens of thousands of Jews in order to tighten his grip against the Ptolemies
- Antiochus IV aligned with those in Israel who had no loyalty to the Lord

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### Daniel 11:31

- 1. Antiochus IV promoted Hellenism
- 2. Antiochus IV outlawed Judaism
- **3.** Antiochus IV desecrated the Temple
- 4. Antiochus IV terminated Israel's animal sacrifices
- 5. This period represented some of the darkest eras for Judaism
- 6. It is also predicted in Daniel 8:9-14

- 1. Antiochus IV operates by "smooth words" & flattery
- 2. The Maccabean revolt
- 3. Those with "insight" will help others
- 4. Rebels will bring down the wrath of Antiochus IV
- The righteous ones were few in number ("little help") at first but grew in number as they faithfully encouraged others
- 6. Some Israelis will defect to Antiochus IV


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


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


## Why is Daniel 11:36-45 About Antichrist and not Antiochus IV?

- 1. It does not fit the known facts of history
- The king is not from the North only but is in conflict with both the North and the South
- 3. It is consistent with the prophecies about the future Antichrist (Dan. 7; 2 Thess. 2; Rev. 13; 17)
- 4. The Antichrist is prominent in Daniel's earlier prophecies ("little horn" of Dan. 7)
- 5. Prophetic gaps are common in Scripture

### 6 Reasons for Gap in the 70 Weeks Prophecy (Dan. 9:24-27)

- 1. Events prophesied v.26
  - Messiah crucified v.26a
  - 70 AD holocaust v.26b
- Prophecies in Dan. 9:24 would have been fulfilled 7 years after Palm Sunday
- **3**. Jesus indicated a gap (Matt. 24:15, 21-22, 29-30)
- **4**. Daniel 9:27 was never fulfilled historically
- 5. <u>Gap occurs elsewhere (Is. 61:1-2; Luke 4:16-21;</u> <u>Isaiah 9:6)</u>
- 6. Early church fathers indicated a gap



## Zechariah 9:9-10

<sup>9</sup> Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout *in triumph*, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, <u>your king is coming to</u> you; He is just and endowed with salvation, Humble, and mounted on a donkey, Even on a colt, the foal of a donkey.<sup>10</sup> I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim And the horse from Jerusalem; And the bow of war will be cut off. And He will speak peace to the nations; And His dominion will be from sea to sea, And from the River to the ends of the earth.




# Why is Daniel 11:36-45 about Antichrist and not Antiochus IV?

  - d) "The indignation" (11:36)


