
Gal 5 Overview

4: Balance in the Christian Life

• <u>No</u> to legalism (1-12)

 \bullet <u>No</u> to license (13-15)

• <u>Yes</u> to the Spirit (16-26)



Gal 5:1-12 Overview

Exhortation to reject legalism (5:1)

Reasons (5:2-12)-Legalism:
Makes Christ unnecessary (2)
Obligates one to keep the whole Law (3)
Causes us to fall from grace (4-6)
Thwarts spiritual progress (7-10)
Empties the cross of its offense (11-12)

Exhortation to Not Return to Legalism (5:1)

• "Therefore" (Eph 4:1; Rom 12:1)

Christ has set us free

Stand firm

Do not return to slavery


