- Different names for God used for different literary purposes
- 10. Editorial insertions added after Moses completed the bulk of the work
- 11. Polytheism to monotheism trajectory never proven

- 4. Genesis 1:6-7 and il Peter 2 tells of a camapy of "water above the firmament." Many adertists believe this camapy of water (or possibly ice) presided greater oir pressure and a shield from the sun's harmful rays. These factors could explain the great age and size of mon and animals before the flood. After the flood, the camapy was gare and the life span drapped off rapidly in the reat flow generations. - 5. The tower of Babel incident probably took place during the days of Peleg when the corth was divided (see Gen. 10.25). 
- A nation that does not know where it has been does not know where it is going
