

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


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5. The Vine and Branches (John 15)

For the message of the \underline{Cross} is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. 1 Corinthians 1:18










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Doctrinal Statement

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
Dispensational Theology is a System of Theology

Traditional-normative dispensational theology is a system that embodies three essential, fundamental concepts called the *sine qua non* (lit. "without which is not"):

- 1. The **consistent** use of a plain, normal, literal, grammatical-historical method of interpretation;
- 2. Which reveals that the **Church is distinct from Israel**;
- 3. God's overall purpose is to bring **glory to Himself** (Eph. 1:6, 12, 14).

Question #1

What is the chief end of man?

Man's chief end is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever.

Mark Twain, *Autobiography*, 2:37 "A myriad of men are born; they labor and sweat and struggle for bread; they squabble and scold and fight; they scramble for little mean advantages over each other. Age creeps upon them and infirmities follow; shames and humiliations bring down their prides and their vanities. Those they love are taken from them, and the joy of life is turned to aching grief. The burden of pain, care, and misery grows heavier year by year. At length ambition is dead, pride is dead, vanity is dead; longing for release is in their place. It comes at last-the only un-poisoned gift earth ever had for them-and they vanish from a world where they were of no consequence; where they achieved nothing, where they were a mistake and a failure and a foolishness; where they left no sign that they have existed-a world that will lament them a day and forget them forever."
