The Son of God and King of Israel (John 1:35-51)^a

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Passage (John 1:35-51)

1. Taken in two parts: verses 35-42, then verses 43-51

John 1:35-42

³⁵ Again, the next day, John stood with two of his disciples. ³⁶ And looking at Jesus as He walked, he said, "Behold the Lamb of God!" ³⁷ The two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus. ³⁸ Then Jesus turned, and seeing them following, said to them, "What do you seek?" They said to Him, "Rabbi" (which is to say, when translated, Teacher), "where are You staying?" ³⁹ He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where He was staying, and remained with Him that day (now it was about the tenth hour). ⁴⁰ One of the two who heard John [speak], and followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. ⁴¹ He first found his own brother Simon, and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated, the Christ). ⁴² And he brought him to Jesus. Now when Jesus looked at him, He said, "You are Simon the son of Jonah. You shall be called Cephas" (which is translated, A Stone). ¹ (John 1:35-42)

- 1. The two disciples heard him [John the Baptist] speak, and they followed Jesus (John 1:37)
 - A. Based on John's proclamation of Jesus as the Lamb of God, they left John and went over to Jesus
 - B. Connected this "Lamb of God" with the "coming one" that John had already mentioned that was preferred/greater
 - C. We discussed the significance of Jesus as "the Lamb of God" in the previous session
 - D. John the Baptist hasn't yet stated, "He must increase, but I must decrease." (John 3:30), but is already seeing the transition focus away from his ministry as these two disciples depart to follow Jesus
- 2. Andrew, Simon Peter's brother (John 1:40)
 - A. Already a disciple of John the Baptist, prior to the ministry of Jesus
 - B. We have found the Messiah (John 1:41)

- I. Andrew declares Jesus to be "the Christ" before the subsequent declaration by his brother Peter, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16)
- II. Which is translated, the Christ (John 1:41) a title, "the anointed one," designated by God to serve a special role
- 3. "You shall be called Cephas. . . A Stone" (John 1:42)
 - A. Although Andrew follows Jesus first, Jesus knows that Peter will serve a role of greater significance
 - B. Cephas from the Aramaic word, Kepha meaning "rock"³
 - Used of Peter in several passages (John 1:42; 1Cor. 1:12; 3:22; 9:5; 15:5; Gal. 2:9)
 - C. "A Stone" is from the Greek term, Πέτρος [*Petros*] from which we derive "Peter"
 - I. "You are Peter (Πέτρος [Petros]) and upon this rock (πέτρα [petra]) I will build my church . . ." (Matthew 16:18)

John 1:43-51

- ⁴³ The following day Jesus wanted to go to Galilee, and He found Philip and said to him, "Follow Me." ⁴⁴ Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. ⁴⁵ Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found Him of whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." ⁴⁶ And Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." ⁴⁷ Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward Him, and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom is no deceit!" ⁴⁸ Nathanael said to Him, "How do You know me?" Jesus answered and said to him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." ⁴⁹ Nathanael answered and said to Him, "Rabbi, You are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" ⁵⁰ Jesus answered and said to him, "Because I said to you, 'I saw you under the fig tree,' do you believe? You will see greater things than these." ⁵¹ And He said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, hereafter you shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man." (John 1:43-51)
- 1. He [Jesus] found Philip . . . Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter (John 1:43-44)
 - A. Was Philip in the proximity because of contact with the two brothers, Andrew and Peter?
 - B. *Philip found Nathanael* . . . (John 1:45) God often works through *seemingly* insignificant personal associations
 - I. Nathanael not mentioned in synoptic gospels some suggest he is Bartholomew

- 2. "... of whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote" (John 1:45)
 - A. Moses "the prophet" (Deu. 18:15)
 - B. Prophets many, many passages
- 3. Nathanael's response: "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (John 1:46)
 - A. Many unfamiliar with His actual origin: Bethlehem.
- 4. Jesus saw Nathanael . . . and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom is no deceit!" (John 1:47)
- 5. Nathanael's astonishment, "How do you know me?" (John 1:48)
 - A. "Before Philip called you . . . under the fig tree . . . I saw you." (John 1:48)
 - I. Something only Philip would have known
 - II. Jesus' evidences knowledge of both past (Philip) and future (naming of Peter)
 - B. Response: "Rabbi, You are the son of God! You are the King of Israel!" (John 1:49)
 - I. "Rabbi" = "my great one" or "my teacher"
 - II. Notice the combination of titles found in Psalm 2 son of God and King
 - III. We now have both portions of Peter's famous declaration stated in advance, probably in Peter's hearing
 - a. Andrew: the Messiah . . . the Christ (John 1:41)
 - b. Nathanael: son of God (John 1:49)
 - c. Peter: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:18)
 - IV. It is one thing to hear and another to believe and profess!
- 6. "... hereafter you shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man." (John 1:51)
 - A. Jesus identifying with Jacob's ladder (Gen. 28:12-14)
 - ¹² Then he [Jacob] dreamed, and behold, a ladder was set up on the earth, and its top reached to heaven; and there the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. ¹³ And behold, the Lord stood above it and said: "I am the Lord God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and your descendants. ¹⁴ Also your descendants shall be as the dust of the earth; you shall spread abroad to the west and the east, to the

north and the south; and in you and in your seed all the families of the earth shall be blessed. (Genesis 28:12-14)

- I. Set up on earth, reaching into heaven
- II. The LORD stood above it and said . . . to Jacob
 - a. A restatement of land promise, and blessing to all families of the earth
- III. Serves as a conduit for messengers (angels = τρος [mal āk] = ἀγγέλους [angelous]) between God and man
- IV. The emphasis is on communication between God and man, especially *from* God *to* man
- V. Jesus, as angel (messenger) of YHWH has served in this role⁴
- VI. Jacob considered it the gate ([ša 'ar], entrance area) of heaven (Gen. 28:17), similar to Babel ("door/gate of god", Gen. 11:5,9)
- B. Descending/ascending between heaven and earth (Pr. 30:4)

Who has ascended into heaven, or descended? Who has gathered the wind in His fists? Who has bound the waters in a garment? Who has established all the ends of the earth? What is His name, and what is His Son's name, If you know? (Proverbs 30:4)

- C. At His ascension, He went up, angels came down (Acts 1:9-11)
- D. The bread that came down from heaven vs. "whose father and mother we know" (John 6:41-42)
 - I. In distinction to "... Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph" (John 1:45)
- E. Jesus as mediator between heaven and earth (1Ti. 2:5)

For there is one God and one Mediator between God and men, the Man Christ Jesus, (1 Timothy 2:5)

F. Told of earthly and heavenly things (John 3:12)

"If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how will you believe if I tell you heavenly things?" (John 3:12)

- G. "Son of Man" as well as Son of God
 - I. Incarnation of deity
 - II. Spanning the gap between heaven (deity) and earth (humanity)
