



C. Gaius, Quartus, Erastus (23)



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


In in 1929, among the excavated ruins of ancient Corinth was discovered an inscription on a marble paving stone bearing the name of Erastus. The inscription read: **ERASTVS. PRO. AED. S. P. STRAVIT**, which is an abbreviation of **ERASTUS PRO AEDILITATE SUA PECUNIA STRAVIT**. The inscription translates as "Erastus, in return for his aedileship, laid this pavement at his own expense." The office of <u>aedilis</u> was the commissioner of public works and, for this reason, a high ranking public official belonging to the Roman ruling class in a city. Paul mentions an Erastus from Corinth in his Letter to the Romans (16:23) and identifies him as "the city treasurer"... (<u>oikonomos</u>)

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

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


