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I. Definition of God's Glory

A. Original language

- 1. OT Hebrew-kavod
- 2. NT Greek-doxa



B. Definition

- 1. "Beauty, power, or honor; a quality of God's character that emphasizes His greatness and authority." (NNIBD)
- 2. God's brightness, brilliance, splendor

Distinctives of Dispensationalism

- Importance of grace In every age, believers are always saved by grace.
- Sine qua non "without which there is not"
 - God's primary purpose on earth is doxological.
 - Consistent, literal method of hermeneutics.
 - Separate programs for Israel and the Church.



Distinctives of Covenantism

• A system of interpreting the Scriptures on the basis of two covenants: the covenant of works and the covenant of grace. Some add the covenant of redemption.

 God's primary purpose on earth is redemptive.

Partial allegorical system of hermeneutics

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By way of definition, the Shechinah Glory is the visible manifestation of the presence of God. It is the majestic presence or the manifestation of God in which He descends to dwell among men. Whenever the invisible becomes visible and whenever the omnipresence of God is localized, this is the *Shechinah* glory...Other titles give it the sense of "dwelling," which portrays what the Shechinah does. The Hebrew word Shechinah, from the root *shachan*, means "to dwell." The Greek skeinei, which is similar in sound as the Hebrew Shechinah...means "to tabernacle."




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
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DAN 9:27 OVERVIEW OF TRIBULATION PERIOD

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

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Lordship Salvation Defined

• "Lordship Salvation refers to the belief which says the sinner who wants to be saved must not only trust Christ as his substitute for sin, but must also surrender every area of his life to the complete control of Christ."

Lordship Salvation:

- Changes the gospel
- Places an impossible burden upon the unsaved
- Ignores the reality of a carnal Christian
- Confuses justification with sanctification
- Destroys the assurance of salvation

• "...because upwards of 150 passages of Scripture condition salvation upon believing only (cf. John 3:16; Acts 16:31)

- Gen 15:6-Then he <u>believed</u> in the LORD; and He reckoned it to him as righteousness.
- John 3:16-For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life.
- Acts 16:30-31-"Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" They said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved..."

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 Every true believer is promised positional and ultimate sanctification with the *possibility* of progressive development in life spiritually, (progressive sanctification) (Heb. 10:10,14; Jn. 17:17; Eph. 5:26,27; 1 Thess. 4:3,4; 1 Jn. 3:2).

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Article XI—Assurance





e believe it is the privilege, not only of some, but of all by the Spirit through faith who are born again in Christ as revealed in the Scriptures, to be assured of their salvation from the very day they take Him to be their Savior and that this assurance is **not** founded upon any fancied discovery of their own worthiness or fitness, but wholly upon the testimony of God in His written Word, exciting within His child The Light Statement





Article 3.6-God has provided the remedy for our disobedience by sending His Son, Jesus Christ, to be the sacrifice for our sins. God has determined that we do not receive forgiveness as a result of our religious deeds or other good works, no matter how well intended, but only by personal faith in Jesus Christ. Those who receive Jesus Christ as their Savior are at that point born of the Spirit and are assured of an eternity in Heaven. (Romans 5:6-9; Romans 4:5; Ephesians 2:8,9; John 3:5-18). Article 3.6

Lordship Salvation:

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- Confuses justification with sanctification
- Destroys the assurance of salvation
- Appeals to human pride and detracts from God's glory



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
