




Condition for Receiving the Gospel (1-2)





- <u>Soldiers</u>: OT saints & Tribulation martyrs (Rev 20:4)


Captives: Unsaved of all ages (Rev 20:5)





 Future body: spiritual, heavenly body proceeding from Christ


