The superiority of the full revelation of Christ in comparison to OT Judaism is shown through Christ's superiority to every major vestige of Judaism

#### "Believe" Defined

pisteuō..."to believe," also "to be <u>persuaded</u> of," and hence, "to place <u>confidence</u> in, to <u>trust,</u>" signifies, in this sense of the word, <u>reliance</u> upon, not mere credence. It is most frequent in the writings of the apostle John, especially the Gospel. He does not use the noun...Of the writers of the Gospels...uses of the verb...John ninety-nine.
