

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
## ZECHARIAH'S EIGHT NIGHT VISIONS

Vision	Reference	Meaning
The Red-horse Rider among the Myrtles	<b>1:7-17</b>	God's anger against the nations & blessing on restored Israel.
The Four Horns & the Four Craftsmen	<b>1:18-21</b>	God's judgment on the nations that afflict Israel.
The Surveyor with a Measuring Line	<b>Chapter 2</b>	God's future blessing on restored Israel.
The Cleansing & Crowning of Joshua the Hight Priest.	<b>Chapter 3</b>	Israel's future cleansing from sin & reinstatement as a priestly nation.
The Golden Lampstand & the Two Olive Trees	<b>Chapter 4</b>	Israel as the light to the nations under Messiah, the King-Priest.
The Flying Scroll	<b>5:1-4</b>	The severity & totality of divine judgment on individual Israelites.
The Woman in the Ephah	<b>5:5-11</b>	The removal of national Israel's sin of rebellion against God.
The Four Chariots	<b>6:1-8</b>	Divine judgment on Gentile nations.

  2. Four horns & four craftsmen (1:18-21)
  3. Man with the measuring line (2)
  4. Cleansing of the High Priest Joshua (3)

  8. Four chariots (6:1-8)
- Conclusion: crowning of Joshua (6:9-15)



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

4. Prediction of future blessing (8:18-23)



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

# Zechariah 12

(Israel's Physical & Spiritual Salvation)



- I. Israel's physical deliverance (12:1-9)
  - A. The nations that will attack Israel (1-3)
  - B. The God who will protect Israel (4-9)
- II. Israel's spiritual deliverance (12:10-14)
  - A. God's Spirit: the cause of revival (10a)
  - B. Israel's remorse: the result of revival (11-14)



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## Ezekiel 36:24-28

“For I will take you from the nations, gather you from all the lands and bring you into your own land. <sup>25</sup> Then I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you will be clean; I will cleanse you from all your filthiness and from all your idols. <sup>26</sup> Moreover, I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; and I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. <sup>27</sup> I will put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes, and you will be careful to observe My ordinances. <sup>28</sup> You will live in the land that I gave to your forefathers; so you will be My people, and I will be your God.”



## Ezekiel 37:7-11

So I prophesied as I was commanded; and as I prophesied, there was a noise, and behold, a rattling; and the bones came together, bone to its bone. <sup>8</sup> And I looked, and behold, sinews were on them, and flesh grew and skin covered them; **but there was no breath in them.** <sup>9</sup> Then He said to me, “Prophecy to the breath, prophecy, son of man, and say to the breath, ‘Thus says the Lord GOD, “Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe on these slain, that they come to life.”’” <sup>10</sup> **So I prophesied as He . . .**



## Ezekiel 37:7-11

... commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they came to life and stood on their feet, an exceedingly great army.

<sup>11</sup> Then He said to me, “Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel; behold, they say, ‘Our bones are dried up and our hope has perished. We are completely cut off.’”



# Israel's Two Regatherings

<b>THE PRESENT (FIRST) REGATHERING</b>	<b>THE PERMANENT (SECOND) REGATHERING</b>
Return to part of the land	Return to all the land
Return in unbelief	Return in faith
Restored to the land only	Restored to the land and the Lord
Sets the stage for Tribulation (discipline)	Sets the stage for Millennium (blessing)

## John 16:7-11

“<sup>7</sup> But I tell you the truth, it is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you; but if I go, I will send Him to you. <sup>8</sup> And He, when He comes, will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment; <sup>9</sup> concerning sin, because they do not believe in Me; <sup>10</sup> and concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father and you no longer see Me; <sup>11</sup> and concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world has been judged.”

## Gen 15:6


Then he believed in the LORD; and He reckoned it to him as righteousness.

"Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" They said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved..."






# Charles L. Feinberg

*God Remembers: A Study of Zechariah* (Wheaton: Van Kampen, 1950, p. 223).

“The mourning of Hadadrimmon...in the valley of Megiddo was on the occasion of the slaying of the godly King Josiah by Pharaoh-Necho of Egypt...[2 Chronicles 35:22-27]. The Chronicles passage reveals how great was the lamentation over the king. And rightly so, for ‘this was the greatest sorrow, which had fallen on Judah. Josiah was the last hope of it’s declining kingdom...In Josiah’s death the last gleam of the sunset of Judah faded into night.’”



## Zechariah 12:12-13

“<sup>12</sup> The land will mourn, every family by itself; the family of the house of David by itself and their wives by themselves; the family of the house of Nathan by itself and their wives by themselves; <sup>13</sup> the family of the house of Levi by itself and their wives by themselves; the family of the Shimeites by itself and their wives by themselves.”



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## Romans 11:25-26

“<sup>25</sup> For I do not want you, brethren, to be uninformed of this mystery—so that you will not be wise in your own estimation—that a partial hardening has happened to Israel until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in;<sup>26</sup> and so all Israel will be saved; just as it is written, ‘The Deliverer will come from Zion, He will remove ungodliness from Jacob.’”

3. Levi – priests (14a)
4. Shimeites – ordinary Levites  
(Num. 3:21)-citizens (14b)




## Zechariah 13:8-9

<sup>8</sup>“It will come about in all the land,” Declares the LORD,  
“That two parts in it will be cut off and perish; But the third will be left in it.”  
<sup>9</sup>“And I will bring the third part  
through the fire, Refine them as silver is refined, And test them as gold is tested. They will call on My name, And I will answer them; I will say, ‘They are My people,’ And they will say, ‘The LORD is my God.’ ”



## Jeremiah 30:7

“Alas! for that day is great, There is none like it; And it is the time of Jacob’s distress (Gen. 32:8; 35:10), But he will be saved from it.”
