


The Book of Genesis, 417

"Genesis 26:35 tells about the effect on his parents of Esau's marriage to foreign wives: They were a grief of mind unto Isaac and to Rebekah. In Hebrew, it means a 'bitterness of feeling' or a 'bitterness of spirit.' Esau's marriages emphasized his continuing unfaithfulness to the Abrahamic Covenant. Just as the selling of the birthright shows he despised his birthright and its covenantkeeping element, now by the same token the marrying of *Hittite* wives was a further step downward in his unfaithfulness to the covenant."
