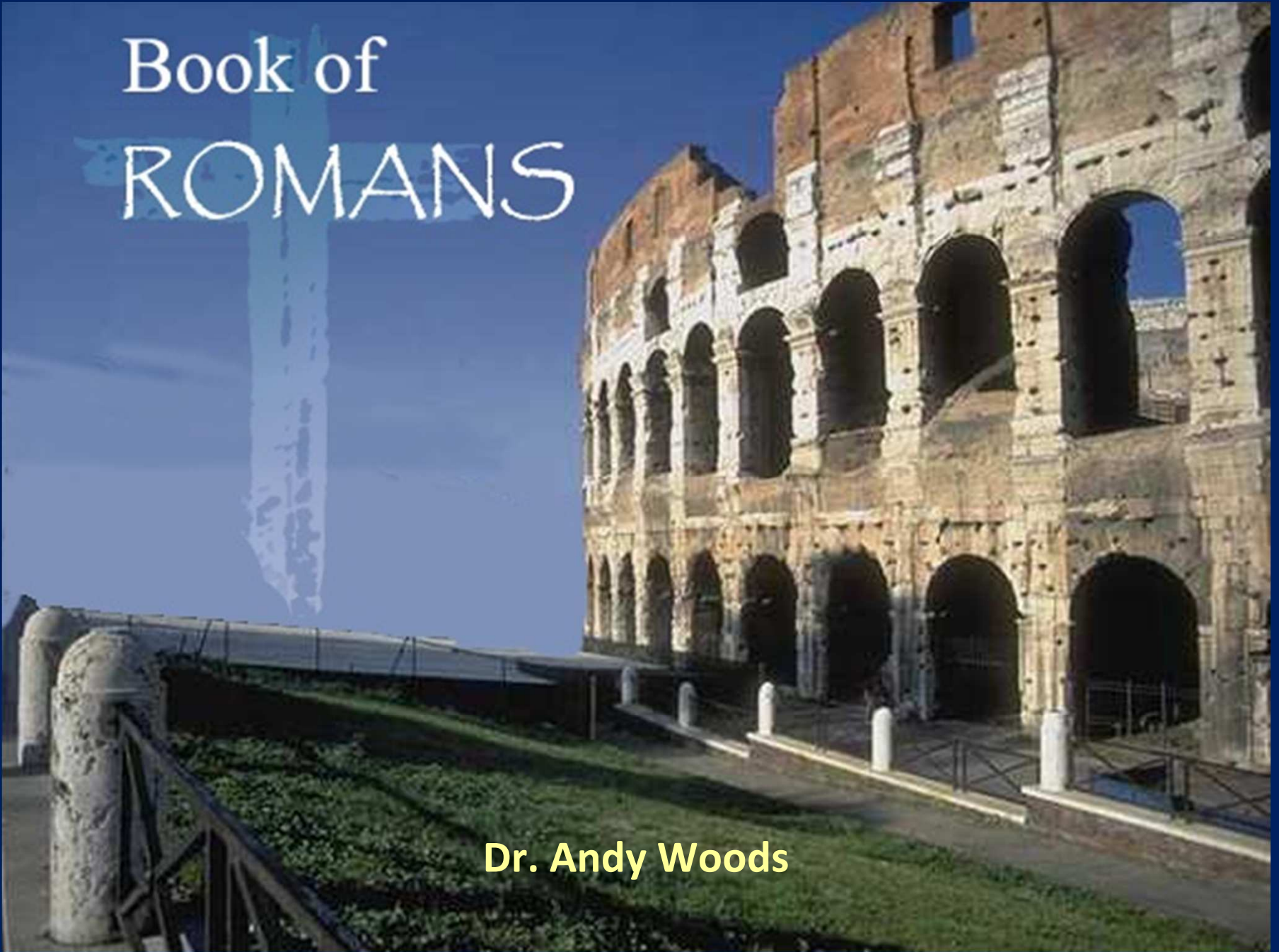
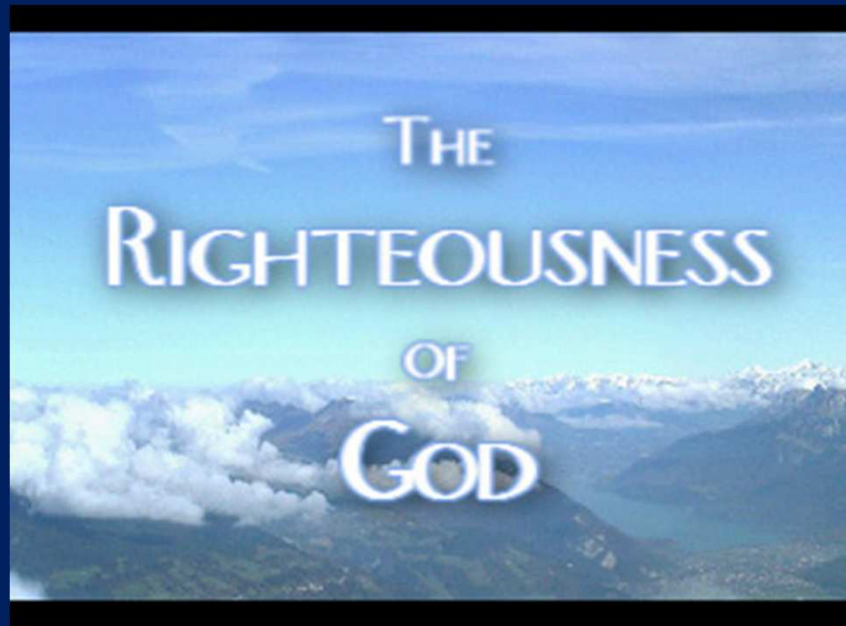

Three Tenses of Salvation

Phase	Justification	Sanctification	Glorification
Tense	Past	Present	Future
Saved from sin's:	Penalty	Power	Presence
Scripture	Eph 2:8-9; Titus 3:5	Philip 2:12	Rom 5:10

2. Every master will invoke a payment
 - a. Sin: death (Gen 2:17)
 - b. Obedience: Righteousness

3. Deut 30:19



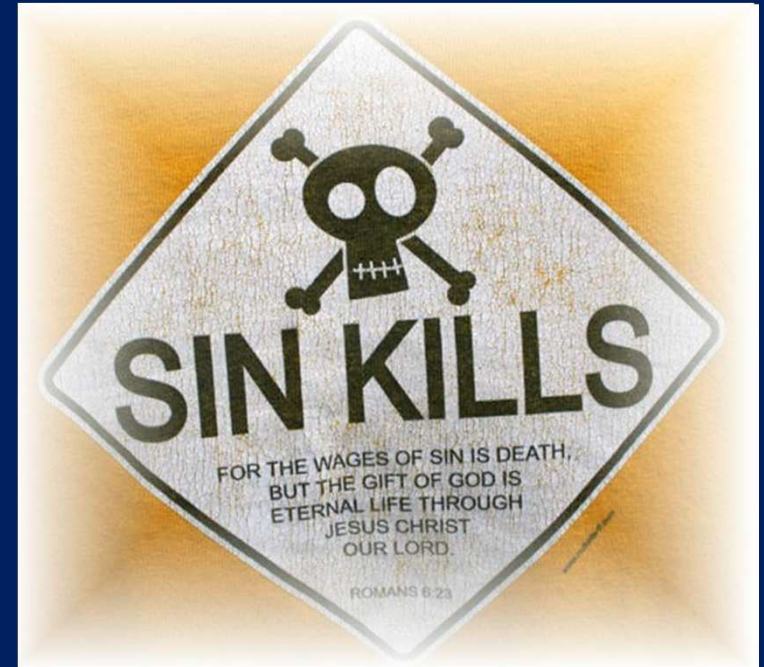
3. Thesis Explained (6:17-22)

1. Sin = death (6:23a)



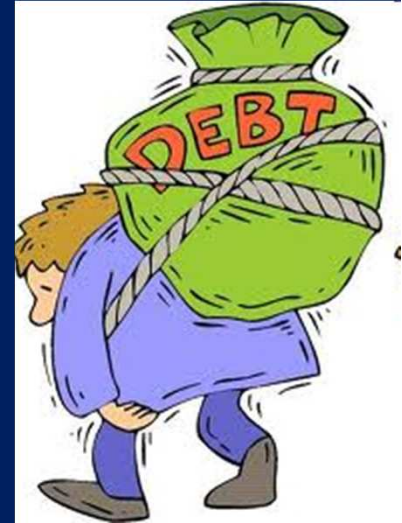
2. Obedience = life (6:23b)

"Sin... will take you farther than you want to go!"

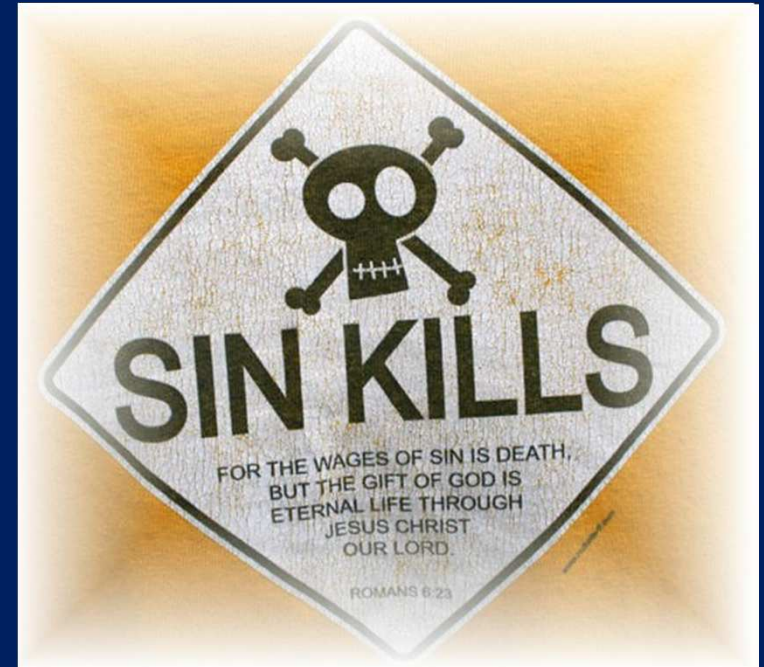
"Sin... will keep you longer than you want to stay!"
